
Calendar Options for Families: The Lincoln Public Schooks District understands and appreciates that our community has a wide variety of rich and varied religious celebrations and observances. In the event families recognize these holidays, parents should notify schools. Students will be given excused absences and allowed reasonable opportunities to make up any schoolwork missed.

Note: Changes to the calendar may occur as a result of inclement weather or other circumstances. If sufficient school time is lost as a result of calendar changes, and it brings the total number of school hours for the year below the state minimum requirements, the Superintendent will implement a plan for making up this time, which may require additional minutes added to the day, additional days added to the calendar, days previously identified as non-student days re-scheduled as student day, or other appropriate calendar or schedule measures.



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# **CLINTON BEFORE/AFTER SCHOOL TRAFFIC PLAN**

- Clinton Street is a one-way street going east before and after school
- Students may come onto school property each morning at 7:45 (no earlier). Please wait for the supervisor to signal before getting out of cars or crossing streets
- All grade levels will dismiss from front playground area.
   K-2 will walk to designated areas on basketball court.
- Please do not block driveways when you park your cars to wait for dropoff and pick-up of students.
- Please do not use the church parking lot behind Clinton.

Thank you for following this plan to ensure a safe, orderly arrival and dismissal.

**Drop-off/Pick-up Zones:** 7:45 a.m. - 4 p.m. on school days 10 minute maximum waiting with driver in vehicle

**School Bus Only Zone:** No parking from 8 a.m. - 4 p.m. on school days.

**No Stopping Area:** No stopping anytime.

**Note to Parents:** The traffic circulation around your school has been reviewed by the Lincoln Police Department, Traffic Engineer's Office and the Public School's Safety Consultant. We recommend that this plan be followed by parents around the school for the safety of students walking or being driven to and from school. Your cooperation is greatly appreciated.

### SCHOOL ARRIVAL AND BREAKFAST

All students at Clinton are provided a free breakfast each morning. Children who eat breakfast may enter the school grounds at 7:45 a.m. No students are to be on the school grounds prior to 7:45 a.m. except those participating in a special activity or CLC.

Students arriving after 8:15 a.m. must check in the office and will be counted tardy.

### **LUNCH**

For the 2024-2025 School Year, Clinton Elementary will be on the Community Eligibility Provision (CEP), a special USDA option for schools with a high percentage of free lunch enrollment. This means that every student who attends Clinton receives school meals at no charge. Please note that extras such as milk for a sack lunch from home or a second lunch will be charged at regular prices. An extra milk will be 60 cents; non-student and second lunch prices will be announced.

Students' lunch cards are scanned each day after students choose their lunch.

The United States Department of Agriculture and the Nebraska Department of Education Competitive Foods Policy states that "no food may be sold or served that competes with the national School Lunch and/or Breakfast programs one half hour prior to the serving period." This means that no food may be sold (i.e. pop, snack machines, fundraisers), and no food may be brought in to treat for birthday parties, class rewards, or class parties during or just prior to school breakfast/lunch times. Also, parents may not bring in food for more than their child. Students eating school lunch are not allowed to bring snack items into the cafeteria.

We welcome you to join your child for lunch. If you plan to join your child for lunch, please contact the **Clinton office** at **402-436-1132**. The price of school lunch for adults and children who are not LPS students will be announced.

Any questions you may have regarding the breakfast or lunch program at Clinton School should be directed to the **cafeteria manager**. You may call **402-436-1132** and ask for the cafeteria

### **DISMISSAL**

To maximize learning time, we ask that students not be picked up prior to school dismissal. To comply with the LPS threat assessment policy, when parents/guardians must pick up a child before the regular dismissal time, they must check in at the office. The school will only release students to adults designated by the parent as emergency contacts on the enrollment form. If there are special circumstances, such as a court order limiting access to a student by a parent or guardian, affecting who a student can be released to, the principal must be informed and provided with a copy of that order to maintain on file at the school.

- Teachers will escort all students to the front playground area at 2:53 p.m.
- K-2 students walk to the basketball court for pick up each day.
- Students staying after school must exit with their class and return with their teacher.
- Students will not be allowed back into the building after they have been dismissed without their teacher or adult.
- Students staying after school for longer than 10 minutes will notify their parent/ guardian by phone.
- Students will not be allowed to play on the playground while waiting for rides after school.

### **LATE PICK UP**


- Students not picked up by 3:00 p.m. will be taken to the Family Care Coordinator.

If you need after school care, the Community Learning Center is available.



# **CLINTON CLC**

### **AFTER SCHOOL CLUBS**

Clinton CLC offers after school clubs free of charge to all Clinton students. Sign-up sheets for clubs are completed at the beginning of each semester. Clubs are filled on a first come-first served basis and limited to the first 15 students to enroll. Students will be notified whether they are enrolled or placed on a waiting list for each club they sign up for. If a student is enrolled in a club, they must complete and submit a CLC Enrollment Form prior to beginning their club. When clubs are in session, students have a snack in the cafeteria following school dismissal, participate in clubs from 3:10-4:00 p.m., and are then dismissed from the front school doors at 4:00 p.m.

### **CORE PROGRAM: AFTER SCHOOL CARE**

CEDARS offers licensed before and after school care to Clinton students. This Core Program incorporates academic support, homework help, recreational time, and enrichment activities in its daily programming. Care is provided after school until 6:00 p.m. Care is also available from 7:00 a.m.-6:00 p.m.

# MULTI-TIERED SYSTEMS OF SUPPORT FOR BEHAVIOR: MTSS-B

Multi-Tiered systems of support for behavior includes proactive strategies for defining, teaching, and supporting appropriate student behaviors to create positive school environments.

At Clinton Elementary, we want all students to be successful. In order to ensure students find success, Lincoln Public Schools has developed a framework of best practices for supporting student behavior throughout the school day. This framework includes evidence-based practices that we know lead to more positive outcomes for students. Some of the most powerful practices faculty and staff use include:

 Developing and teaching all students our school and classroom expectations

 Acknowledging positive behavior when we see it

 Consistently practicing strategies that prevent problem behavior before it happens

Using data to make decisions

 Identifying missing skills and teaching replacement skills

Check-in/Check-out (CICO) is a support for students to monitor their behavior throughout the school day. Students track their progress and work to increase positive behavior choices.

Students are responsible with the support of our staff to conduct themselves in a manner to create a safe, orderly learning environment by following three simple guidelines:

- Be Safe
- Be Respectful
- Be Responsible

Students also focus on the following life goals for behavioral success:

- I can be productive and follow directions even if I don't want to.
- I can take good care of myself, even if I am mad.
- I can be OK, even when others are not OK.

# MENTAL AND BEHAVIORAL HEALTH POINT OF CONTACT

Your student's mental health is important to their academic success. If you have concerns about your student's mental or behavioral health, you can contact the social worker at your student's school/program. LPS social workers are licensed mental health practitioners and can help connect you to appropriate mental health or behavioral supports.



# CONTACT INFORMATION FOR STUDENTS NOT FEELING SAFE

If you feel that your child is being bullied by peers, please contact your child's teacher or the building principal, Angee Luedtke. All reported incidences of bullying/unsafe behavior will follow the protocol outlined in Lincoln Public Schools Board Policy 5482: Anti-Bullying Policy.

Bullying is unwanted, aggressive behavior among school-aged children that involves a real or perceived power imbalance. The behavior is repeated, or has the potential to be repeated, over time.

In order to be considered bullying, the behavior must include:

- Imbalance of Power: Kids who bully use their power—such as physical strength, access to embarrassing information, or popularity—to control or harm others. Power imbalances can change over time and in different situations, even if they involve the same people.
- Repetition: Bullying behaviors happen more than once or have the potential to happen more than once.
- Hurtful aggressive physical and/or verbal behavior.

Bullying includes actions such as making threats, spreading rumors, attacking someone physically or verbally, and excluding someone from a group on purpose.

As an added prevention piece, please discuss with your child adults in the building who they can talk to if they feel that they are being bullied or are in an unsafe situation. These people may include, but are not limited to, their teacher, the administrator, school counselor, school psychologist, school social worker or any other adult with whom they have built a positive relationship.

Students are taught about what bullying looks like and sounds like, along with how to advocate for themselves through the District's Second Step program.

# CLINTON NEIGHBORHOOD ORGANIZATION



# CLINTON PARENT INVOLVEMENT POLICY




